Leviticus 27:30: A tithe of everything from the land, whether grain from the soil or fruit from the trees, belongs to the Lord; it is holy to the Lord.

While the Israelites were on their way from Egypt to Palestine, many instructions were given them. They were starting a new nation in the Promised Land, and they needed to form a good government. They knew how society functioned in Egypt, especially how slaves were treated, but that is not how God wanted this new society to function.

Leviticus 27 is not the first place where tithing is mentioned in the Bible; Abraham had already tithed. Offerings to God were a well-established custom. A tithe, or a tenth, belongs to the Lord. When we bring to God our tithe, we are simply returning something that does not belong to us in the first place. If I get 10 apples, I need to return one to God because it belongs to Him.

Appeal:

Reflect on all that we have received from God. Have I returned the required tenth to the Owner?

Prayer: Thank You, God, for the blessings we receive from You. Help us return to You the small percentage You have requested of all that belongs to You!
