HEALTH CORNER

The Healing Powers of the Aloe Vera Plant

Every household should have an Aloe plant on hand for use on cuts, burns or sunburns. If you choose to grow your own aloe at home to soothe minor burns and wounds simply break off a piece of the Aloe leaf and squeeze the gel onto the injury. Use the older or lower leaves of the Aloe plant first, they contain more gel. The gel will quickly dry into a natural bandage protecting the wound. Meanwhile the gels capillary-dilating properties will increase the blood circulation, thereby reducing the healing time. The gel also works well as a topical treatment on shingles providing immediate relief when combined with vitamin E. However, if you want beautiful skin it is best to use the fresh gel from the plant and not the preserved form you find in commercial products. Through processing a lot of the chemical compounds are lost. Aloe-Vera juice is also used internally for medicinal purposes. It can be used to soothe the pain from ulcers, hearthurn, and an irritated esophagus. However, when purchasing a juice for drinking be sure that it contains 98% aloe Vera and avoid products that list a loin or aloe-emodin on the label. Aloe-Vera juice can also be used internally to aid digestion. The plant has about 200 biologically active compounds including vitamins, enzymes, minerals, and amino acids and these compounds all work together synergistically to aid in digestion and bowel function.
