HEALTH CORNER

MOBILE PHONES

Stop those long discussions on cell; just as you must stop giving children below the age of 12 to use cell phones

Mobile phone: "possibly carcinogenic to humans" (IARC). A warning against the use of mobile telephones has been issued by the World Health Organization after scientists identified a potential link with a type of brain cancer. Researchers analyzing the evidence for a link between mobile phone use and brain cancers concluded there "could be some risk" of the brain cancer glioma being caused. On gliomas, however, they were concerned that the evidence was mounting. The IARC cited a 2010 study which identified a 40 per cent increase in the level of risk for people who in the 10 years up to 2004 had used mobile phones for an average of 30 minutes or more every day.

In response to the finding, the WHO's International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC) has urged the public to be cautious;

- Use hands-free devices rather than have phones pressed against your heads
- Send text messages where possible instead of calling. "ALERT TODAY, ALIVE TOMORROW"
