Only three hundred men cupped the water in their hands, bringing it up to their mouths so they could keep their eyes on the movements of their enemies. They were the ones whom God chose to go with Gideon.

All 32,000 that first responded were supposedly fearless. Were some physically unfit for battle? Did they secretly doubt God's ability or willingness to deliver Israel? When the 10,000 had been given a second option to leave and also go back home, they decided to stay with Gideon. Why then did they fail the simple test of how to drink water when thirsty? What was uppermost in their minds?

To obey is better than sacrifice, and to heed is better than the fat of rams. For rebellion is like the sin of divination, and arrogance like the evil of idolatry. Because you have rejected the word of the Lord, he has rejected you as king."

It didn't take long for Saul to change from someone of the "smallest tribe of Israel" and "the least of all the clans of the tribe of Benjamin" (1 Sam. 9:21) into someone who set up "a monument in his own honor" (15:12) and have his own interpretation of God's directions.
